

Intensive Behavioral Therapy Home Program for Daughter with Autism

- Providing optimal conditions for skill development by organizing and structuring home environment to address different developmental needs
- Interviewing various providers to ensure service delivery based on the child's and family needs

- Implementing behavioral therapy (ABA, Floortime and Social Thinking), speech and occupational therapy when the child was not with a therapist
- Training professionals how to best implement therapy for the child
- Corresponding and maintaining positive relationships with teachers, therapists and consultants
